Pediatric Receiving Facilities in Wyoming

Campbell County Health's (CCH) Campbell County Memorial Hospital (CCMH) has been recognized as a Pediatric Receiving Facility by the Wyoming Department of Health's Emergency Medical Services for Children (EMSC) and Wyoming Hospital Preparedness programs.

Weston County Health Services is also being recognized as a pediatric receiving facility. There are only three in the state of Wyoming.

The Wyoming Pediatric Recognition Program is an evidence-based approach to ensuring minimum services, equipment, disaster preparedness and staff competencies are in place in a facility that may treat an acutely injured or ill child in Wyoming. The program is funded by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) state partnership grant and is completely voluntary.


The aim of Wyoming's Pediatric Facility Recognition Pro-
